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Iroquois Announces Selection of a Site for a New Compressor Station in Dover, N.Y.

After several months of deliberation, the Iroquois Pipeline Operating Company today informed town officials in Dover and Union Vale that the company has decided on a location in Dover, N.Y. as its preferred alternative for the site of a new compressor station.

Although the Dover site is Iroquois' preferred alternative, both will be included in the company's Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) filing for the project. The Union Vale property will be identified as an alternative location for the proposed compressor station.

Iroquois conducted extensive surveys of two properties, one in each community, investigation aspects—for example, environmental, archeological, geological, hydrological, air quality, land use—of each site, in order to make a thorough evaluation of it prior to making a selection.

Iroquois' application to the FERC will incorporate all of the information gathered in the assessments of both locations.

Iroquois owns and operates three compressor stations, located in Athens, Wright, and Croghan, New York.
