Iroquois Gas Transmission System, L.P., through its wholly-owned subsidiary, Iroquois Pipeline Operating Company, operates a 414-mile interstate natural gas transportation pipeline extending from the U.S.-Canadian border at Waddington, NY, through New York State and western Connecticut to its terminus in Commack, NY, and from Huntington to the Bronx, NY. Iroquois is regulated by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.

Iroquois was created in 1985 as a cooperative venture with a promise to bring reliable supplies of competitively priced natural gas into the Northeast. Since commencing full operations in 1992, Iroquois has continued to fulfill that promise by providing supply diversity and safe, reliable delivery of natural gas to meet the growing needs of the Northeast, while maintaining an ongoing involvement that contributes to the economic opportunity and quality of life in the towns, cities and regions we serve and pass through.

In a typical year, Iroquois transports enough natural gas to heat approximately 3.2 million homes, displacing the energy equivalent of more than 50 million barrels of oil.
